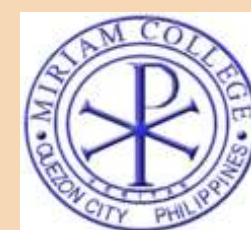

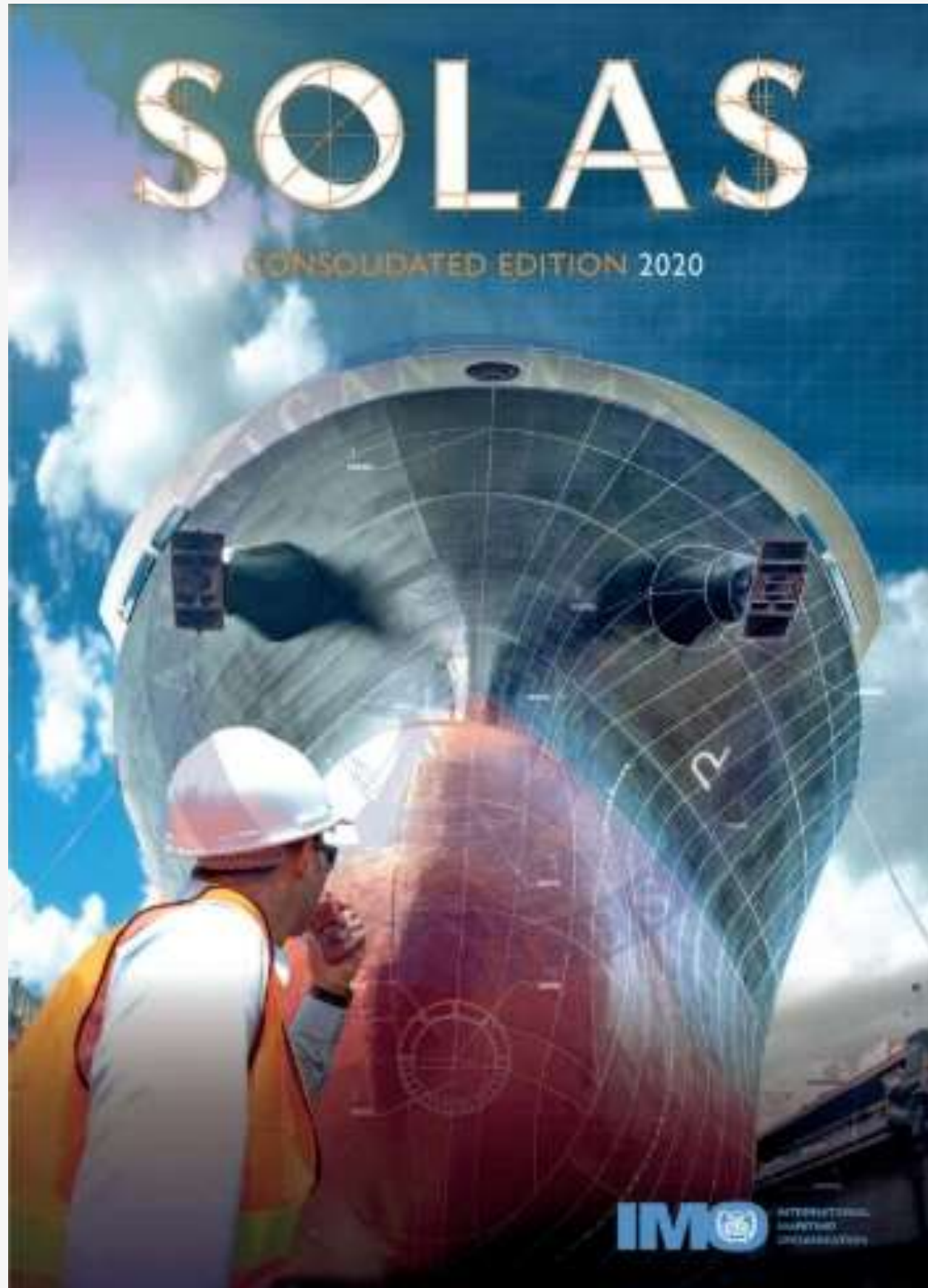
# Importance of Marine Regulations?

- environmental protection.



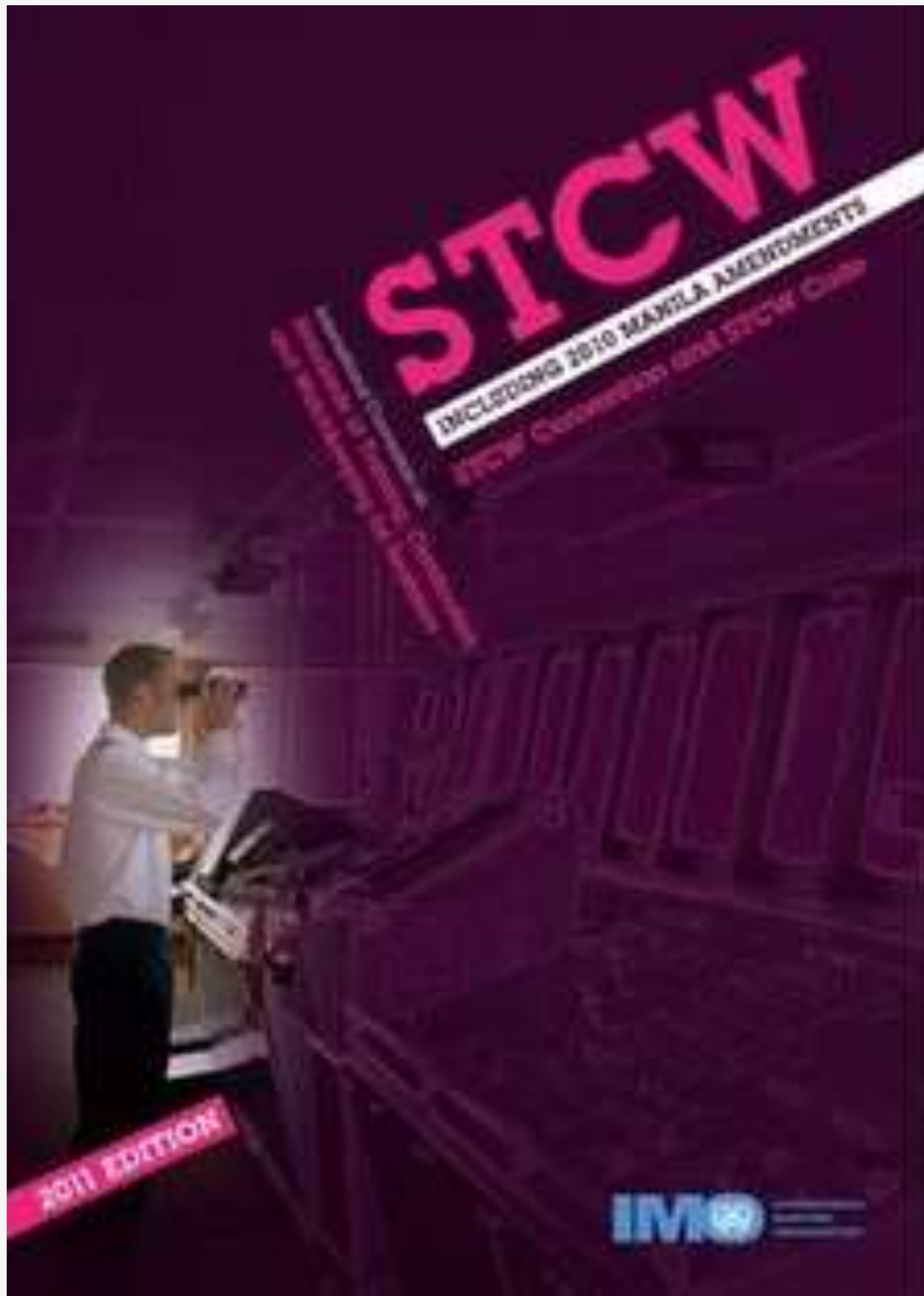


# SOLAS or the 'International Convention for the Safety Of Life At Sea'

Ensures the

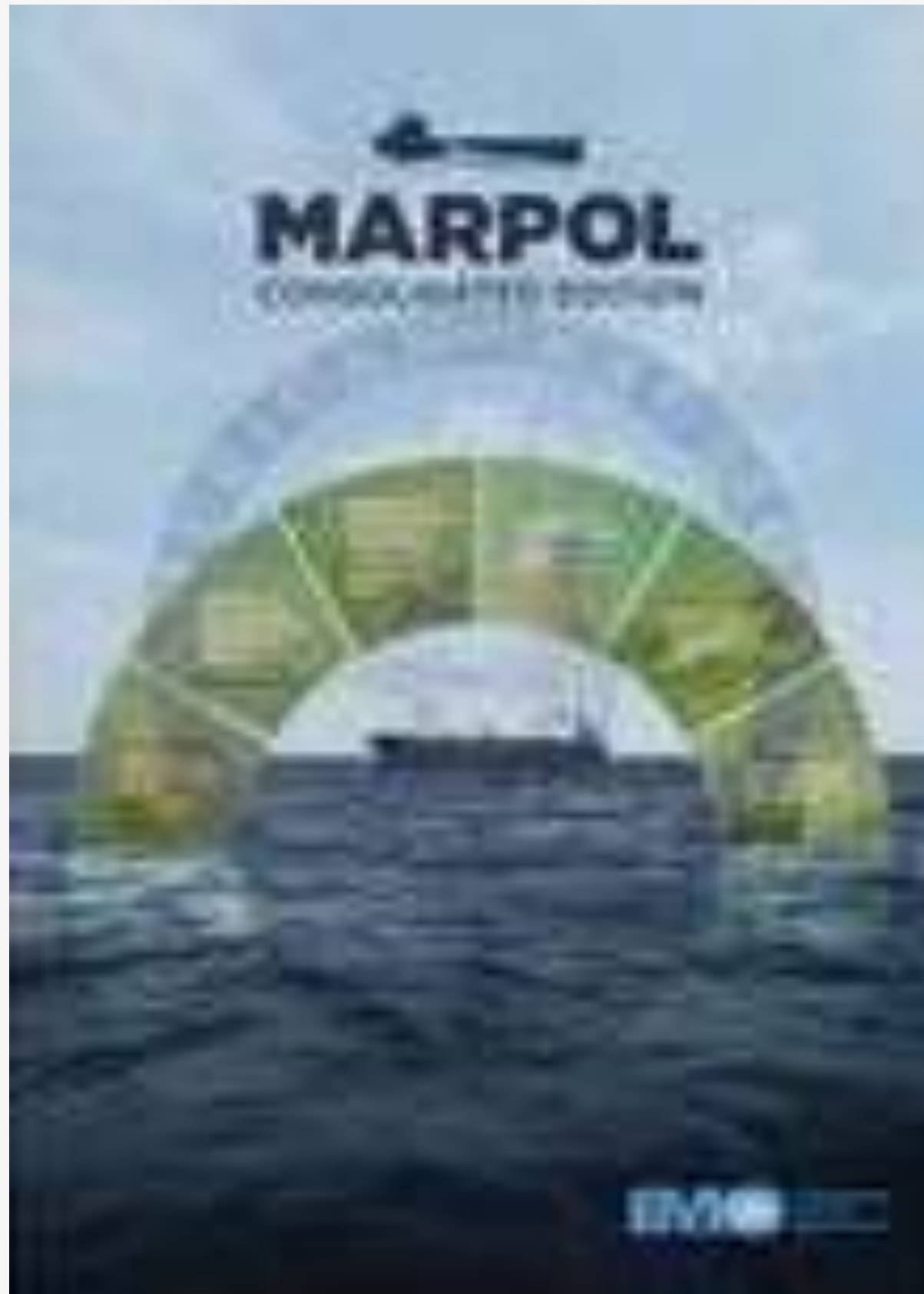
- safety of crew and personnel onboard vessels and
  - ships flagged by signatory-States comply with the minimum safety standards concerning the construction, equipment, and operation
- ( sinking of TITANIC collided with an iceberg on April 14, 1912 resulted to adoption of SOLAS)





# STCW or the 1978 Intl Convention on 'Standards of Training, Certification, and Watchkeeping (STCW)

- entered into force in 1984, amended in 1995 then 2010 known as Manila Amendments
- ensures qualification of crew and personnel on board



# MARPOL (Intl Convention for Prevention of Pollution from Ships)

- **Addresses pollution by oil from ships** (Annex I ); also **noxious liquid substances**, such as chemicals, carried in bulk (Annex II); **harmful substances** carried in packaged form (Annex III); **sewage discharges into the sea** (Annex IV); and the disposal at sea of ship-generated garbage (Annex V).

# In January 2021 we have..

- **Resolution MSC.428(98): - Maritime Cyber Risk Management**
- **Resolution MEPC.315(74): Amendments to MARPOL Annex II**
  - wherein A new term 'persistent floater' has been added to the definitions under cargo residues and tank washings.
- **Resolution MEPC.318 (74) & Resolution MSC.460(101): Amendments to IBC Code**
  - extensive changes to the International Code for the Construction and Equipment of Ships Carrying Dangerous Chemicals in Bulk (IBC Code). Vessels carrying bulk liquid prone to the formation of hydrogen sulfide (H<sub>2</sub>S) will have to take H<sub>2</sub>S detection equipment.
- **Resolution MSC.462(101): International Maritime Solid Bulk Cargoes (IMSBC Code) amendments.**
  - Hence some vessels may require their certificate of fitness to be amended.



- Resolution MEPC.248(66): **Approved stability instrument for oil tankers** like The International Oil Pollution Prevention (IOPP) Certificate to be amended accordingly.
- Resolution MSC.377(93): **Approved stability instrument for gas carriers** to which the Code for the Construction and Equipment of Ships Carrying Liquefied Gases in Bulk (GC Code) applies
- Resolution MEPC.250 (66) and MSC.369 (93): **Approved stability instrument for chemical tankers**, which should be reflected in the certificate of fitness.
- Resolution MEPC.286(71): **Designation of the Baltic Sea and the North Sea Emission Control Areas for NOX Tier III control)**
- Resolution MSC.461(101): **Amendments to the International Code on the Enhanced Programme of Inspections During Surveys of Bulk Carriers and Oil Tankers, 2011 (2011 ESP Code)**
- Resolution MSC.434(98): **GMDSS Performance Standards**
- EU Regulation 1257/2013: **Ship recycling regulation**
