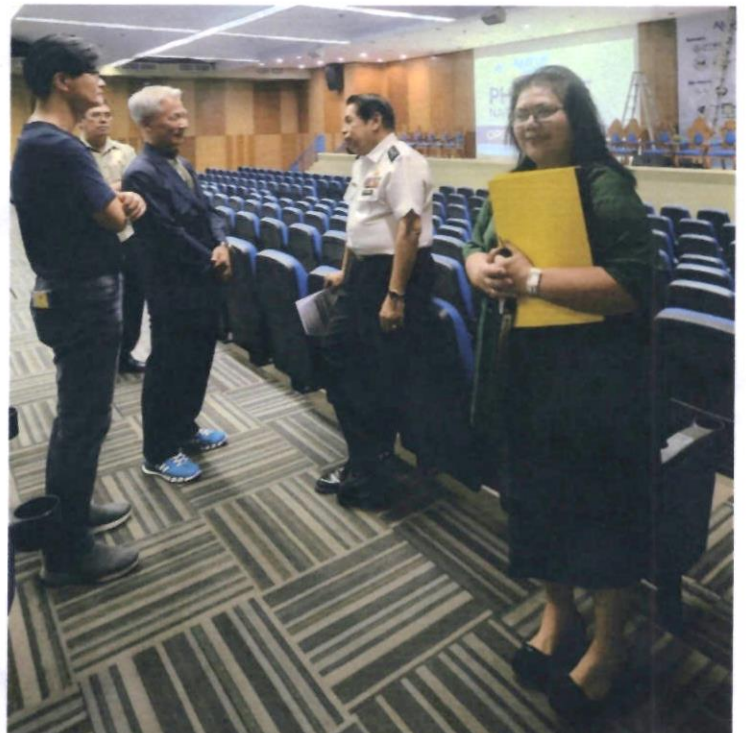

The Opening Ceremonies

The 21st AMFUF was participated in by eight (8) **member institutions** (25 foreign delegates) from nine (9) **countries** such as **Georgia, India, Indonesia, Korea, Myanmar, Taiwan, Thailand, Vietnam**, and the **Philippines**. MAAP, as host and 2023 AMFUF President, extended the invitation to **non-AMFUF members** who are members of the **Philippine Association of Extension Program Implementers, Inc. (PAEPI)** and the **Philippine Association of Maritime Institutions (PAMI)**. PAEPI comprises more than 200 Higher Educational Institutions in the Philippines, and PAMI comprises more than 70 Maritime Institutions in the country. Most of the PAMI members are also PAEPI Global members. The Philippines has 17 regions. Eight **regions in the country** were represented by **11 universities and colleges** with **15 delegates**, either presidents or authorized representatives, who provided the authority or power to vote and participate in the meeting and network with global partners on behalf of their respective institutions. The MAAP 40 delegates include 13 paper presenters (8 faculty members and six students), the 5 Chair of the local organizing Committee, the 13 liaison officers responsible for all foreign and local delegates, and nine (9) MAAP executive officers and department heads. Eighty-one eminent guests attended the event.
