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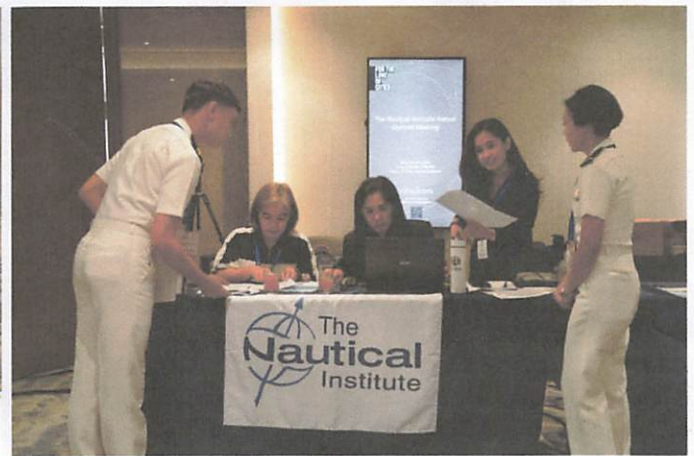
## June 27, 2024—Citadines Bay Hotel, Manila

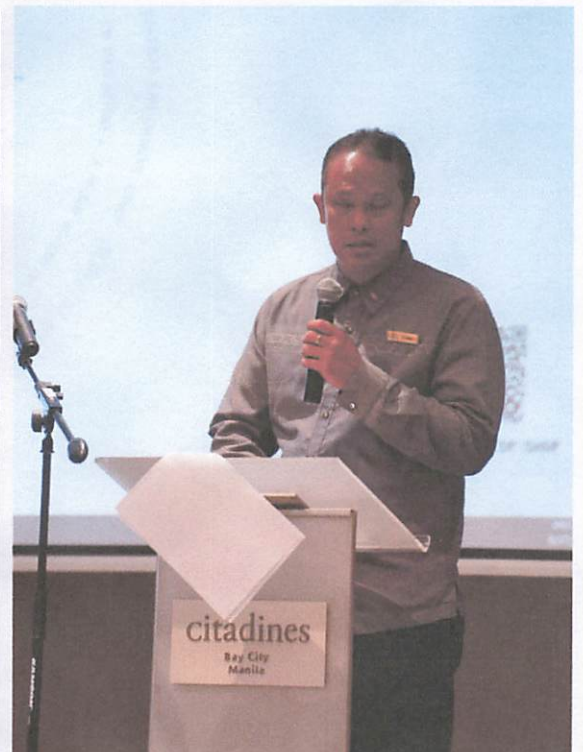

## Session 1: Safety Briefing, Welcome Address and Keynote Address



### WELCOME TO THE PHILIPPINES

VADM Eduardo Ma R Santos AFP (Ret), FNI MAAP President and Nautical PH Branch's President welcomed our delegates from London, Australia India, Thailand and other maritime institutions from the Philippines.

### WELCOME ADDRESS

Capt. André LeGoubin FNI, Former President of the Nautical Institute, welcomed delegates on the first day of the conference and emphasized the importance of preparing the next generation to adapt to rapid industry changes and secure the future of maritime professionals on his welcome remarks. He introduced the Great Cadet Survey, a global initiative addressing cadets' concerns, and his book "Mentoring at Sea," which underscores the importance of a mentoring culture in onboard training.



## Session 1: Safety Briefing, Welcome Address and Keynote Address



### SPECIAL PRESENTATION: NAVIGATING PRIORITIES IN MARITIME

Mr. Dan Aldrich Tolentino, Training Manager of IMEC, discussed "Navigating Priorities in Maritime," emphasizing the importance of time management and prioritization in the industry. Mr. Tolentino noted that despite ongoing innovations, the sustainability of the maritime industry ultimately depends on future seafarers.

Mr. Gerardo Borromeo, CEO of The PTC Group, discussed the future of seafaring in an era of safer, smarter, and greener shipping. He emphasized the need for investment in maritime education, training, and safety, and highlighted the government's role in developing policies, regulations, and budgetary support to help the industry navigate continuous changes

## Session 2: New Career Aspirations— A Cadet Panel Session

The keynote address and presscon continued with a cadet panel session chaired by Capt. Andre LeGoubin where panelists from various maritime institutions shared and discussed their career aspirations and onboard experiences. They provided insights on issues such as preparedness, onboard culture, Internet connectivity, and the need for wages for cadets.

## THE FUTURE OF MARITIME EDUCATION MULTIPURPOSE CURRICULUM APPROACH

### Dr. Chalermvut Thansuvan

continued the keynote address with his topic “The Future of Maritime Education: a Multipurpose Curriculum Approach,” aiming to determine the right competencies, function, and curriculum to adapt to recent maritime trends, especially Maritime Autonomous Surface Shipping (MASS) and Green Technology.

Dr. Thansuvan identified the challenges of adopting these advancements such as reliability to autonomous systems, potential impact on employment, the transition from traditional to autonomous operation, and harmonization of international standards and regulations.

### C/E Bobby Caceres, Course Developer and Instructor at MAAP

discussed the introduction of maritime education in training in MAAP and the Philippines where he emphasized the urge to explore topics of decarbonization, alternative fuels, new engine propulsion drive, MASS, and Digital Twin and Data Analytics as demands for the future of maritime industry.



C/E Caceres enumerated the challenges encountered during the simulation training at the latest Innovation Building in Maritime Academy of Asia and the Pacific, featuring a Remote Operation Center, Multitask Engine Room Simulator, and Celestial Navigation Simulator.

discussed about the Implications for the maritime workforce, new fuels, automation and remote operations and support and development—STCW Review.

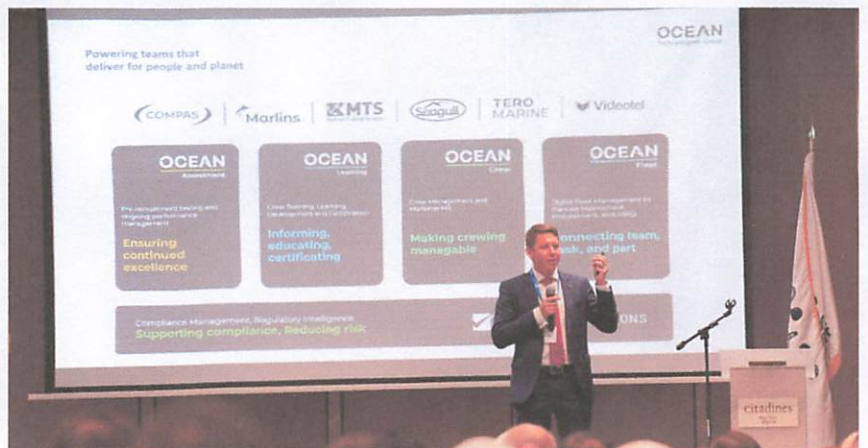




