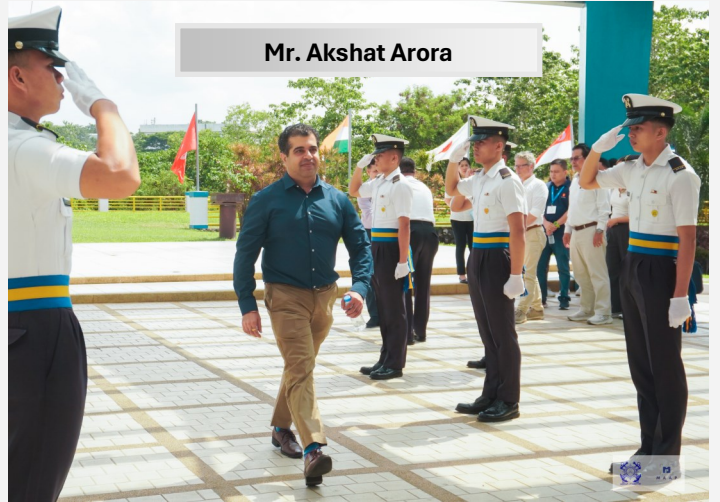

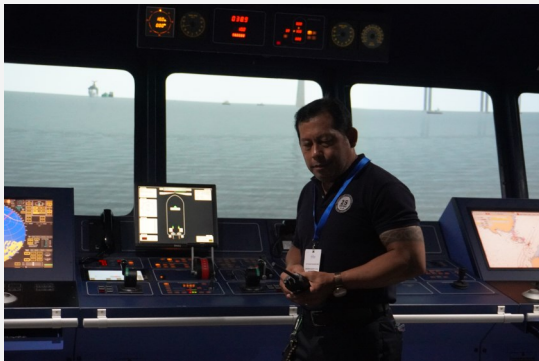
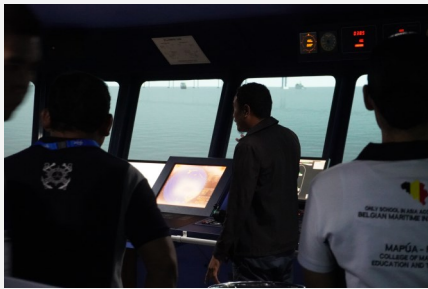

Key Issue—Workshop with Cadets

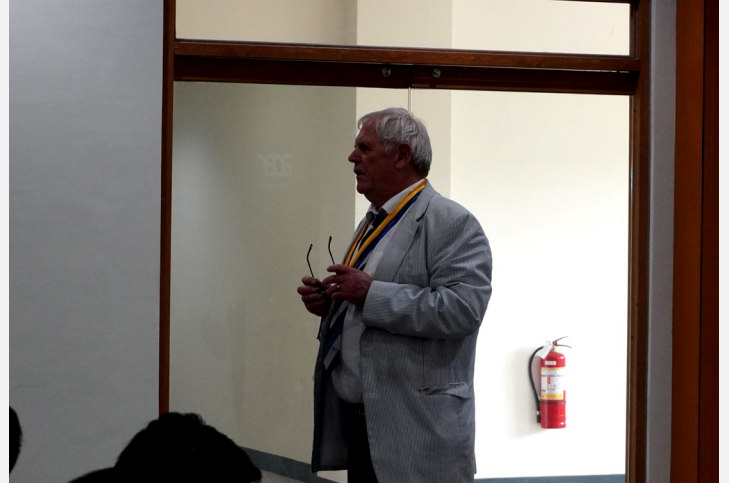
