
### The Opening Ceremonies

The 21st AMFUF was participated in by eight (8) member institutions (25 foreign delegates) from nine (9) countries such as Georgia, India, Indonesia, Korea, Myanmar, Taiwan, Thailand, Vietnam, and the Philippines. MAAP, as host and 2023 AMFUF President, extended the invitation to non-AMFUF members who are members of the Philippine Association of Extension Program Implementers, Inc.
